Labor Day is a federal holiday celebrated annually on the first Monday in September. The holiday is rooted in the late nineteenth

century, when labor activists pushed for a federal holiday to recognize the many social and economic achievements workers have made to America's strength, prosperity, and well being.

Beginning in the late nineteenth century, as the trade union and labor movements grew, trade unionists proposed that a day be set aside to celebrate labor. In the United States, Peter J. McGuire, a union leader who had founded the Brotherhood of Carpenters in 1881, is generally given credit for the idea of Labor Day.

In 1882 McGuire suggested to the Central Labor Union of New York that there be a celebration honoring American workers. On September 5th that year some 10,000 workers, under sponsorship of the Knights of Labor, held the first Labor Day Parade in New York City. There was no particular significance to the date; McGuire said that is was chosen because it fell roughly halfway between the Fourth of July holiday and Thanksgiving.

In 1884, the Knights of Labor adopted a resolution that the first Monday in September be considered Labor Day. The idea quickly spread and by the following year Labor Day celebrations were being held in a number of states.

In 1894, there was a series of unemployed workers' riots on May Day (May 1*) in Cleveland as an *unofficial* observance rooted in socialist movements. Shortly thereafter, on May 11*, the workers of the Pullman Palace Car Company in Chicago (manufacturer of railroad cars) rioted due to their 25% cut in wages and no corresponding reduction in rent - the majority of workers lived near Chicago. In solidarity, other workers of the American Railroad Union also went on strike. The widespread railroad strike and boycott severally disrupted railroad traffic in the Midwest. The federal government's response to the unrest marked the first time an injunction was used to break a strike. These two incidents prompted President Grover Cleveland to propose a bill that would make Labor Day a national public

holiday. The bill was crafted in part to deflect attention from May Day, and was signed into law on June 28, 1894.

Canada's Labor Day is also celebrated on the first Monday of September. More than 80 countries celebrate *International Workers' Day* on May 1^{*}, the ancient European holiday of May Day.


Who knows what the 70's and 80's will bring? Stay tuned. If you understand the reference "stay tuned," then you're old like me.
