SUPERMOONS

Briar



There are **four Supermoons** in a row in 2023. The first was July 2nd. Following are two in August —the Full Sturgeon Moon on August 1st and the Blue Full Moon on August 30th. The 4th, the Harvest Moon on September 29th.

The Moon makes one complete orbit around Earth in about 29.53 days. Its orbit around the Earth is not a perfect circle – it's an elliptical/oval shape. Earth doesn't sit directly in the middle of this elliptical orbit. Because of this, the Moon's distance from Earth changes as it travels around our planet. There are points in the Moon's orbit where it's closest and farthest from Earth. These points are called *perigee* (the point in the Moon's orbit where it is **closest** to Earth) and *apogee* (the point in the moon's orbit where it's **farthest** from Earth). The term "Supermoon" was coined by astrologer Richard Nolle in 1979 and specified that the moon must be within 90% of perigee.

When the moon is high overhead or low in the sky, it's dwarfed by the vast hemisphere of the heavens and appears to our eyes as a small disk in the sky. A Moon near the horizon will always look enormous, thanks to a well-known phenomenon called the *Moon Illusion*, which makes our minds exaggerate the size of objects near the skyline. It's viewed in relation to earthly objects such a chimneys, buildings, or trees whose size and shape provide scale. Your brain compares the size of the Moon to these reference points; suddenly the Moon looks enormous!

So if you want to be guaranteed to see a hugelooking Moon on any night, it's easy ,,, simply watch the moon when it's rising or setting! **BOARD OF DIRECTORS** Jillian LaVelle



August 8 ~ "NATIONAL DOLLAR DAY"



National Dollar Day commemorates the day when Congress established the U.S. monetary system on August 8, 1786. The U.S. Constitution expressly stated that only the United States Federal Government has the power to coin money for the country; and in 1792, the U.S. Mint was born. While the U.S. Mint coined "official U.S. money," individual states were allowed to print their own paper bills. In fact, prior to 1860, there were approximately 10,000 different varieties of paper money in use throughout the United States! The <u>official</u> "one-dollar bill" (Federal Reserve Note) was printed in 1862.

Do you know whose face was printed there? It wasn't *George Washington*. The first dollar bill featured *Salmon P. Chase*, President Lincoln's Secretary of Treasury. Then in 1869, George Washington's name and face first appeared on a dollar bill. Back then, the bill was larger – just a little over 7" x 3"; now it's "6.14" x 2.61."

When Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, and John Adams gathered to design the seal (they were the first of three committees to make suggestions). They didn't suggest a pyramid, but they did discuss an eye. They wanted the seal to have a symbol of divine providence, and the all-seeing eye shaped like the top of the pyramid is an ancient symbol of divinity.

There are many things represented on the back of the one dollar bill. The number 13 appears often representing the original 13 states. On the Great Seal of the United States, the pyramid shows 13 steps and the unfinished top represents a young country growing and expanding. The Eye of Providence includes the Latin motto *Annuit Coeptis*, which means "It is favorable to our undertakings." The eagle represents both war and peace. It's talon on the left holds 13 arrows and the talon on the right an olive branch and 13 olive fruits. Above the Eagle's head there's a constellation with 13 stars and 13 stripes. On the face of the dollar bill, above the number one, a tiny bird peeks out. It's not clear what kind of bird, though.

The dollar bill in our pockets today hasn't been change for over 50 years. To keep ahead of counterfeiters, the \$5, \$10, \$20, and \$50 have had redesigns in recent years.

DEED RESTRICTIONS-PARKING:

17. Due to limited guest parking within the community, the owner of each Lot shall keep a car in their garage, when multiple vehicles are parked on the Lot. A resident of Briar Patch Unit One or Briar Patch Unit Two shall not park in a guest parking area. Guests of residents who intend to be guests for at least three consecutive days shall obtain a guest parking permit from the Association before they park a vehicle in a guest parking area. No vehicle shall be parked in a guest parking area on more than three consecutive days unless the Association has issued a guest parking permit authorizing such parking. The Association has the right to tow all vehicles parked in a guest parking area in violation of this Section or in violation of written parking rules created by the Association's

Driving along U.S. Highway 19 in Pasco County you'll notice several projects in the works. The busy corridor is undergoing a much-needed facelift – including many major development and construction projects that will reshape the West Market Area for years to come!

"It's exciting to see changes coming to this area, and we're thrilled public and private investors are working together to bring improvements to western Pasco County," says Commissioner Kathryn Starkey. "As our population grows, it's important to make sure areas like this corridor keep up."

Major projects coming to U.S. 19 include:

Holiday Square Property at Flora Avenue ~ A derelict shopping center is transforming into a modern, 355-apartment unit.

Holiday has seen significant changes recently with its newly renovated Holiday Square. Winn Dixie and Tropical Smoothie are just some businesses people can find there. This was a stark difference from 2020 when the developer paid just over \$8 million for the property with a high vacancy rate and a dilapidated building.

"Holiday is growing. I mean, anybody who knows Holiday knows it has a stigma of not being the greatest area, but it's rapidly becoming, like everywhere in Florida, the place where people want to pursue and redo and become more valuable," said Vance McAllister from Mishorim Gold Properties.

Plans to add outdoor seating near the new Tropical Smoothie and more lighting are also in the works. "It does seem like a lot of new things are opening up right now and hopefully we can bring some fun into the area and into Holiday," said Anette Elliott, GM of PK's Play Zone (located on the plaza).

AmSkills Redevelopment at Darlington Road

Soon to be an advanced manufacturing and robotic skills center that will provide our local workforce access to a higher-paying career path with certifications.

Gulf View Square at Embassy Boulevard

The empty Sears location will be transformed into apartment living and the remaining mall will be remarketed toward improved community retail options.

Universal Mall at Moog Road

Public/Private partnership negotiations are underway to demolish blighted commercial structures and redevelop the property as a vertically integrated, mixed-use project.
