
FEBRUARY 2024

BP-HOA Bylaws Review

The covenants we all agreed to live by

4. Unless required by law, absolutely no dogs or visiting dogs of any kind shall be kept on any portion of a Lot, <u>the common area</u>, or <u>any other area in Briar Patch</u> <u>Unit One or Briar Patch Unit Two.</u> No other animals shall be kept on a Lot in Briar Patch Unit One or Briar Patch Unit Two, except that <u>one household cat</u> or two usual household birds may be kept, provided they are <u>kept within the interior portion of</u> <u>the residence</u>. Each dog owner shall <u>control his or her dog on a leash</u> when the dog is in Briar Patch Unit One or Briar Patch Unit Two, except when the dog is confined to the residence in Briar Patch Unit One and Briar Patch Unit Two. Each dog owner shall pick up the feces of his or her dog immediately and dispose of such feces in a sanitary manner promptly.

(DO NOT LET YOUR PET USE ANOTHER FAMILIE'S LAWN)
