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

If you have not had your gutter cleaned, don't wait, get it done. F.Y.I. if your roof is damaged by branches rubbing the shingles or a falling branch, the warranty most likely won't cover the damage. We have received calls from home owners about renting their units. You must have lived in your unit, or your parents who purchased the unit, must have lived in the unit for 3 years. Approval by HOA BOD for rental of unit is required before renting.

The HOA must be notified that you wish to rent your unit. You can only rent to 55+ persons and they have to read the Deed Restrictions. Download the ByLaws & Deed Restrictions form. Sign it, that they have read it and understood it.

The owner of the unit is responsible for any infractions that the renters incur. Renters also have to sign the 55+ Certificate and email both signed certificates to briarpatchnpr@yahoo.com. The lease has to be for one year, not 3 or 6 months. There is only 1 lease allowed per year. The owner has to email the signed rental agreement to briarpatchnpr@yahoo.com.

BYLAWS REVIEW

18. Any changes in landscaping of any Lot are not allowed, without Board approval.

A homeowner wishing to make changes to his or her landscaping, shall file a Landscape Modification form requesting Board of Directors' approval of such changes. Such homeowner shall file the Landscape Modification Form in the Blue Box at the Briar Patch Clubhouse. A member of the Grounds and Roads Committee shall examine each such Landscape Modification form and make a recommendation to the Association's Board of Directors. The Association's Board of Directors shall have the final authority to approve or disapprove all requests for landscape modification. The Association shall have no obligation to maintain any landscaping that was changed at the request of the homeowner. The Association's Board of directors shall have the authority to create written rules governing the types of locations of and maintenance of landscaping that may be placed on the Lot.

30. <u>Any tenant or guest of a lot owner shall be bound by these restrictions.</u> (this means all bylaws & deed restrictions)
