

FYI:

The "720 Statutes" are part of the Florida Codes that state the Rules by which HOA and condominium boards must structure their boards, bylaws and deed restrictions. The statutes describe the operating conditions by which the Bylaws must be written and adhered to. The state legislature has made changes this year. We will review them and make any necessary change to our Bylaws, Covenants and Deed Restrictions as needed. We have a bylaws committee consisting of homeowners, reviewing current bylaws and deed restrictions. We are reviewing the bylaws and will be updating them and making changes as needed. Once we have decided on any change or addition it will go to the HOA Attorney for approval, changes and registration with the state.

As always please familiarize yourself with the bylaws and deed restrictions.

Hello All!

Just a reminder to all those members who chose to pay their dues by coupon or bill pay, please remember to mail your checks a week before the 1st of every month. This gives the post office time to deliver the check and the bank time to process it, For those who use bill pay, they need to set up their payments to be received by Truist Bank by the 1st of each month. All bills are late by the 5th of each month and will be assessed a late fee of 10.00 which will be increased this year. Also interest will be charged.

Assessments and installments on assessments, that are not paid when due, bear interest from that due date until paid at the rate provided in the declaration of covenants or the bylaws of the association, which rate may not exceed the rate allowed by law. If no rate is provided in the declaration or bylaws, interest accrues at the rate of 18 percent per year.

BRIARPATCH HOME OWNERS ASSOCIATION Inc. BYLAWS REVIEW

- i. All Homeowners have the responsibility to maintain the outside of their unit in regard to windows, garage door, service garage door, front door, and porch to maintain the integrity of the community.
- 11. The owner of each lot shall make arrangements for their own garbage and refuse containers to be put out to the curb and taken away from the areas in front of the house or garage. Cans or containers shall not be placed in front of the house or in front of the garage or in the front of any Lot or parcel except on regular collection days and after sunset on the day before regular collections of trash, garbage. Rubbish and recyclable material, as may be provided by any sanitary service unit. Homeowners must remove empty containers from areas in front of the house or garage before sunset on the same day as the contents of the containers were collected by the sanitary service unit.

FRIENDLY REMINDER: PLEASE CHECK YOUR GUTTERS AND HAVE THEM CLEANED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. PLEASE HAVE YOUR TREES TRIMMED SO AS NOT TO HANG OVER AND TOUCH THE ROOF. THE ROOF WARRANTY WILL NOT COVER REPAIR DUE TO TREE DAMAGE. THE HOA WILL SEND AT LEAST THREE NOTICES TO YOU AND DISCUSS WITH YOU ALSO. IF YOU CHOOSE NOT TO ACT ON YOUR OWN BEHALF WE WILL HAVE TO EXPLORE OTHER OPTIONS. PLEASE REMEMBER IF YOUR HOME IS DAMAGED BY WATER INTRUSION FROM A FULL GUTTER OR INSECT INFESTATION YOU BECOME RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REPAIR.

IF YOU NEED ASSISTANCE CONTACT THE HOA VIA THE WEBSITE. WE MAY BE ABLE TO HELP. WE MAY HAVE A LABORER FOR HIRE OR A NEIGHBOR THAT CAN ASSIST.
