PRESIDENTS MESSAGE—Cont'd

Speaking of written, we have bylaws that we ask every month for HO's to read. We have asked for and received HO Insurance Declarations from many but not all. The Florida 720 statutes are the foundation of which HOA & COA's (condo association) build their bylaws. The bylaws in many instances Supersede the 720's and certain applicable state laws. We require you to insure your dwelling unit. We have heard from HO's they don't need insurance or they are self insured. If you are self insured you should have a bond for the value of your unit ( 200-325 thousand dollars) relative to current home prices. If you don't have insurance and you don't have that amount of funds to rebuild your unit, you are fooling yourself and off-putting your risk on to your neighbors. If you think you cannot afford insurance, you cannot afford to rebuild. The problem is we all live in a common building! If a tree went through your unit it affects the neighbor next to you. None of us want a broken or burned out shell next to them with a common roof /attic, which may not be rebuilt quickly. We are asking for the Declaration pages and at some point this will be referred to our attorney. Please read the bylaws review at the end of the newsletter.

Some members have already reached their renewal date. Just the Declarations Page is needed, not the whole Policy. The page with your name, address and dates of coverage is what is required to be on file annually by law. #### **Bylaw Review**

7. No owner shall permit or suffer anything to be done or kept on his Lot which shall increase the rate of insurance on the other Lots, or which shall obstruct or interfere with the rights of the occupants of the other Lots or annoy them by unreasonable noises or create nuisance.

22. Each wall which is built as a part of the original construction of the homes upon the property and placed on the dividing line between the lots shall constitute a party wall. General rules of law regarding party walls and liability for property damage due to negligence or willful acts or omissions shall apply thereto.

13. Enforcing obligations of the Owners and taking such actions as shall be deemed necessary and proper for the sound management of the association.
