## **Alaska: The Last Frontier**

Before our next destination here let's get some history of Alaska. Historians believe that the first Alaskans originally came from Asia across the Bering Land Bridge. Now that location is called the Bering Strait. Indians lived in the area at that time. The Tligit, Haida and Tshimshian Indians lived in the southeast. Their culture was known for building totem poles. Other Indian tribes lived in other areas of Alaska. Today Native people remain a strong presence in Alaska. It was their home. The second migration into Alaska was by the Eskimos. Russia later owned Alaska and colonized it. In 1867 The US purchased Alaska from Russia.

We are still cleaning up from the hurricanes and have more trees that need attention. We had a Board Of Directors meeting please review the minutes. The last item of discussion, asked as a question, was about mailbox replacements. On this subject I am going to want **Every home owner's viewpoint or input**. I am currently pricing boxes so we can **budget for 2025** to start replacement. I am going to create a map of current mailbox locations and the addresses they serve. I will then create a map of proposed locations of replacement boxes. I will attach pictures of the box types. This of course will need POST OFFICE direction and approval. The BOD will also need to approve any plans in open meeting.

We will continue to repair buildings and have a list of siding needing replacement. Duna started painting. Please take a look behind and around your home. If the tree branches are touching your roof or home **YOU** need to have it trimmed. Please inspect your lanai and other screens, replace them as needed. **Some are in terrible dis-repair.**

Bylaw review: 11F. <u>Procure and maintain adequate hazard insurance</u>, <u>liability insurance</u>, <u>and termite insurance on the respective privately owned unit.</u>

7. No owner shall permit or suffer anything to be done or kept on his Lot which shall increase the rate of insurance on the other Lots, or which shall obstruct or interfere with the rights of the occupants of the other Lots or annoy them by unreasonable noises or create nuisance.

We will as usual, follow bylaws, referring homeowners **not** in compliance with this requirement to the HOA attorneys.
